# Italian Canadians as Enemy Aliens: Memories of World War II — a project by Columbus Centre of Toronto

The project has a new public name — Italian Canadians as Enemy Aliens: Memories of World War II. With all the members of the project team on board, the project is moving forward in its initial stages of research, securing potential interviewees for the oral histories and developing its archival/artifact collection.

#### **MEET THE TEAM**

Leading the team is Project Director Lucy Di Pietro (B.A. Honours, M. MSt.), who has over ten years of experience in various aspects of museum work. Supporting Lucy are Researchers/Writers Melina De Guglielmo (B.A. Honours, B.Ed.) and Travis Tomchuk (Ph.D); Exhibit/Collections Coordinator Stefanie Petrilli (B.F.A. Honours, M.A.); and Project Assistants Louanne Aspillaga (B.A. Honours, M.A.) and Krystle Copeland (B.A. Honours, M.A.).

#### **CURRENT WORK**

The project is in the process of identifying and contacting possible interviewees for the development of the oral histories collection. The project is collecting personal memories of those who were either directly affected by the internment, an "enemy alien" designation and other forms of discrimination, or who want to share the experiences of family members. Stories of personal resilience and community initiative during this period are also of interest to the project.

Additionally, any donated or loaned personal objects and their accompanying stories will assist in forming a permanent exhibit that will be housed at the Columbus Centre.

Most recently, the project team has visited potential interviewees and material donors within the GTA and Montreal. Pilot interviews with those confirmed interviewees are currently underway.
